Who Will Follow Jesus?

Jesus at a Pharisee's House

In the 14th Chapter of Luke we find Jesus invited to the house of a prominent Pharisee for a Sabbath dinner. Even though the other guests at the dinner were orthodox Jews who considered Jesus to be a lawbreaker, Jesus graciously accepted their invitation, knowing he would be under their watchful

eyes. While others would have lost their nerve, Jesus met the situation with calmness. Why? He was not willing to pass up this important opportunity to teach about the kingdom of God.

It so happened there was a man at the Pharisee's house who was suffering from the dropsy. Dropsy (Edema) is a condition of excess fluid in the tissues of the body. This man could have been invited there to test Jesus to see what he would do. Jesus kept his cool and challenged them by asking the host and other guests if it was lawful to heal the man on the Sabbath. Keep in mind – to the Orthodox Jew, to heal on the Sabbath was the same as *working* on the Sabbath, therefore it would be breaking the law.

Jesus' question must have caught them off guard, because they all remained silent. So, Jesus took hold of the man and healed him and sent him on his way. Then Jesus asked them,

Luke 14:5-6 (NIV) – "If one of you has a child or an ox that falls into a well on the Sabbath day, will you not immediately pull it out?" And they had nothing to say.

While Jesus was teaching those sitting at the table about the kingdom of God, one man spoke up and said, "Blessed is he who shall eat bread in the kingdom of God!" (Luke 14:15) It is interesting to note that the religious leaders present at this Sabbath dinner, were self-assured that they had reserved places in God's kingdom. Why their confidence? The average orthodox Jew believed that only Jews would be present at the great feast of God. They never conceived that gentiles and sinners would find a place at the table. Their

belief was so off-base, Jesus utilized this man's statement to teach the truth through a parable.

The Parable of the Great Supper

Luke 14:16-24 (NKJV) – Then He [Jesus] said to him, "A certain man gave a great supper and invited many, and sent his servant at supper time to say to those who were invited, 'Come, for all things are now ready.' But they all with one accord began to make excuses.

The first said to him, 'I have bought a piece of ground, and I must go and see it. I ask you to have me excused.' And another said, 'I have bought five yoke of oxen, and I am going to test them. I ask you to have me excused.' Still another said, 'I have married a wife, and therefore I cannot come.'

So that servant came and reported these things to his master. Then the master of the house, being angry, said to his servant, 'Go out quickly into the streets and lanes of the city, and bring in here the poor and the maimed and the lame and the blind.' And the servant said, 'Master, it is done as you commanded, and still there is room.' Then the master said to the servant, 'Go out into the highways and hedges, and compel them to come in, that my house may be filled. For I say to you that none of those men who were invited shall taste my supper.'" [Bold emphasis added is mine]

In this parable, the master of the house represents God, and the *originally* invited guests to the supper represents the orthodox Jews. They had initially been offered a share of the kingdom, but after all the preparations had been made, they tragically rejected the invitation to participate. Yet, because of God's loving, generous nature to pour out his blessings upon those *willing* to accept his invitation, he determined his table would not be empty. His invitation must urgently go out to the people in the streets and lanes of the city, to the poor and maimed, the lame and the blind. His invitation would go out to the tax collectors and sinners, to those Jews who welcomed and treated Jesus better than the religious folks did.

The servant did as he was told, then reported back to the master that there was still room for more at the table, so the master extended his invitation to go out into the highways and hedges. His invitation to those on the outskirts of the city opened up the *calling* to the Gentiles (the non-Jews) to share in the great supper, to fill up God's house.

Excuses, Excuses!

In the parable the *originally* invited guests, "all with one accord", made their various excuses. Our excuses today do not differ that much.

The first man said he had bought a field. He allowed the claims of business to take priority over God's invitation. Worldly ventures and speculations divert attention away from God.

The second man said he had bought five yoke of oxen and was going to try them out. He allowed his new possessions to crowd out God. In today's world, a new game or a new hobby might be the excuse.

The third man said he had just married a wife and could not come. There was an Old Testament law (See: Deuteronomy 24:5) that said, when a man is newly married he must not be sent to war or have any other obligation laid on him, for a period of one year. He was to be free at home to be happy with his wife. So, he conveniently said *no* to Jesus. The man was actually saying to Jesus, 'Your timing is off'!

Excuses for why folks do not follow Jesus.

Luke 9:59-60 (NIV) — He said to another man, "Follow me." But he replied, "Lord, first let me go and bury my father." Jesus said to him, "Let the dead bury their own dead, but you go and proclaim the kingdom of God."

Often times people will read this statement from Jesus and think, how insensitive. We are not supposed to even bury our own kin folk first? Think about what Jesus was asking here. He was literally putting the offer of God's kingdom on the line. Work in God's kingdom requires total devotion and absolute attention. Jesus knew full well

the customs of the times, and what he was asking of this man. It was a legitimate appeal from Jesus. Besides, there was no indication in this verse of scripture that the man's father was already dead.

The phrase, "I must bury my father" was a common figure of speech, meaning "Let me wait until I receive my inheritance."

In other words, 'Let me wait until everything at home is in order', was this man's excuse. For all we know the father may have had years to live, before this man would be in a position to bury him and then obtain his inheritance. Jesus was declaring that service to the living, *proclaiming* the kingdom of God, is of more importance than burying the dead. The decision was crucial. Following Jesus requires a radical commitment.

As we continue reading in the 9th chapter of Luke, Jesus encounters more excuses.

Luke 9:61-62 (NIV) — Still another said, "I will follow you, Lord; but first let me go back and say goodbye to my family." Jesus replied, "No one who puts a hand to the plow and looks back is fit for service in the kingdom of God."

Jesus was on his way to Jerusalem, so this man had to decide on the spot if he was sincere about following Jesus. Jesus used a clear-cut example from the farming culture to show him that the byword of the kingdom is not backwards, but forward! There is no way that a plowman can plow a straight furrow, if he is looking back over his shoulder. No one who begins the work of the Lord, then looks back with yearning to a worldly life, is fit for service in the kingdom of God. Jesus' followers must not have divided interests. Those who begin the work of the Lord must resolve to go on with it – not to draw back or to turn away from God. It takes patient endurance to continue to do God's will. Brothers and sisters, it takes living by faith.

Hebrews 10:39 (NLT) – But we are not like those who turn away from God to their own destruction. We are the faithful ones, whose souls will be saved.

Followers of Jesus take Action!

There was a man living in the town of Jericho whose name was Zacchaeus. He was a tax collector for Rome and had become very rich. Tax collectors had the reputation of cheating, of keeping money they collected for their own. They were understandably despised by the people.

As Jesus came into Jericho and passed through the town, Zacchaeus, the chief tax collector for the region, responded with unusual enthusiasm.

Why? Zacchaeus was a sinner and knew it. He was not looking for an excuse to get away from Jesus. Zacchaeus was looking for an excuse to come near him! Scripture tells us,

Luke 19:3-5 (NLT) – He tried to get a look at Jesus, but he was too short to see over the crowd. So he ran ahead and climbed a sycamore-fig tree beside the road, for Jesus was going to pass that way. When Jesus came by, he looked up at Zacchaeus and called him by name. "Zacchaeus!" he said. "Quick, come down! I must be a guest in your home today."

Zacchaeus may have been short in stature, but he was definitely not shortsighted! He recognized the gospel truth when he heard it. He climbed down from the tree and with great excitement and joy took Jesus to his house and welcomed him. The radical change in his life, led Zacchaeus to stand before the Lord and say,

Luke 19:8 (NLT) – I will give half my wealth to the poor, Lord, and if I have cheated people on their taxes, I will give them back four times as much.

Jesus responded, "Salvation has come to this home today, for this man has shown himself to be a true son of Abraham. For the Son of Man came to seek and save those who are lost."

(verses 9-10)

That was Jesus' mission! Amen.
